- If you don't have an up-to-date home inventory, walk through your home with a video or still camera. At the same time, make a list of what items you want to take, and have room to take, during an evacuation. An inventory can help facilitate the claim process after the disaster passes.

If you leave...

- Always listen to and obey authorities if they advise you and your family to leave your home.
- Tell your neighbors where you will be going and exchange contact information.
- Respect law enforcement decisions on when you are allowed to return home.
